However the legal drafting has introduced changes to paragraph 147, concerning LDSO charges, that we do not believe are necessary. Under portfolio billing, we charge the LDSO based on the tariff that he has charged the customer. We do not wish to be analysing the portfolio data on a site by site basis to determine what kind of generation is in place there and whether or not the LDSO has applied to us for a tariff change or if we should charge a default tariff. Also, under this definition, there could be timing differences between the commencement date of a tariff change that a LDSO agrees with the customer and the commencement date of the DNO's similar tariff change, due to differences in the date of application, that might cause the tariffs not to match for a month or so.
