**Business Justification Including Market Benefits:**

The requirement to produce a new SLC4a document structure was brought about by discussions at Structure of Distribution Charges Implementation Steering Group (ISG), where it was observed that the distribution UoS charging statement was over burdensome for Suppliers. A sub-group of the ISG was commissioned to provide a view of what an alternative document should contain, and the recommendations have been considered and developed into a three document approach via work undertaken by the ENA Commercial and Operations Group. One covering an overview, one covering SLC4a and one covering Miscellaneous Services.

Ofgem have been involved in the process through both ISG and the Distribution Charges Methodology Forum and interaction with Suppliers has taken place throughout the development.

We now need to submit a DCP to align DCUSA to the Relevant Charging Statement mechanism, which is reaching its conclusion and ready to be presented to Ofgem for draft approval on behalf of the Distributor community. The new package of documents and DCUSA changes must come into being for 1<sup>st</sup> April 2008.
