## 1. Administration

- 1.1 The Chair welcomed all attendees to the meeting. The Chair noted there were no apologies received.
- 2. Urgent Change Proposal Initial Assessment: DCP 376 'Provision of Customer Residual Charging Bands to Suppliers'
- 2.1 DYT presented the 'Provision of Customer Residual Charging Bands to Suppliers' Change Proposal to the Panel.
- 2.2 The Panel discussed the contents of the CP form and queried whether the intent was to include the LLFC of each MPAN and where this wasn't the intent, then the Panel wished to be given an opportunity to consider their options.
- 2.3 DYT noted that he would go back to the CP proposer and to understand the desired intent of the Change.
- 2.4 The Panel agreed that the CP could be progressed to a Change Report once the LLFC matter had been addressed. The Panel agreed that the CP addressed all requirements to be treated as a Part 2 matter and be treated as an Urgent Change.
- 2.5 <u>Post Meeting Note</u>: As the change has now been updated to explicitly cater caters for the provision of the LLFC, the Panel's approval can be considered to have been given for progression to Change Report.
- 3. DCP 374 'Energy Theft Transition into the Retail Energy Code' Change Report
- 3.1 MS presented the 'Energy Theft Transition into the Retail Energy Code' Change Report to the Panel.
- 3.2 MS presented the DCP 374 Change Report to the Panel.
- 3.3 MS noted that as the Change Report form did not receive enough approval to be formally sent to Parties, the Change Report was brought to the Panel to seek official approval.
- 3.4 It was noted that Ofgem accepted that their timescales of their review would be shortened, and that they had raised no general concerns.
- 3.5 The Panel were happy with the Change Report and agreed that it could be sent to all DCUSA Parties for a voting period of 10 Working Days.

4.1 No other business was discussed, and the meeting was called to close.
