-	Anonymous	We would want a message saying that invoices would be £0 as we need to log the details for audit and record keeping	
E.ON	Non-confidential	<p>We do not see any benefit in creating or cascading a £0 invoice, especially where all components to that invoice = £0. However, should there be a combination of positive and negative values but overall nets to £0, then we would still expect to see this.</p> <p>If Distributors cannot suppress these (like today) then we can accommodate the loading of a £0 value invoice, but we see little benefit of this information distribution as we will not load these into our payment systems. We see this as superfluous so our preference would be not to receive the information in the first place.</p> <p>We would also expect that any approach deployed for £0 invoices is adopted by all Distributors, including IDNOs. There needs to be consistency in the approach which is delivered or it erodes the benefit of the design.</p>
